Serving as a background to the cover title and the logos of the 10-member institutions of the network, is ikat and t'nalak, a hand woven abaca cloth originated by most of the tribal groups in Mindanao in southern Philippines, particularly the T'bolis of Lake Sebu, south Cotabato, Manobo and Bagobo of Davao and Cotabato provinces, Bilaan, Mandaya, Tagakaolo, and the Moro Filipinos of Maguindanao and Lanao. Maroon, black or brown and ochre tones represent the fabric's more popular colors.

Within the portal is the logo of the Library Committee emphasizing the network's spheres of influence with the emblazoned acronym DACUN (Davao Colleges and Universities Network) as the node. Two colors in the logo, green and blue, represent what Mindanao is noted for, Mindanao being the food basket of the country and the numerous royalties existing in the island's cultural and ethnic communities.

The key to a successful research depends on both the quality of the content and adequacy of each material (David, L & Matawaran, M, 2008). It is important that the key information on every topic is easily retrieved by the researcher. This is where periodical indexes help as they provide the fundamental stage in research.

A periodical index is a type of reference source that lists periodical articles by subject or author. If you have a topic in mind, a periodical index can help you find articles about that topic. It will point you to the right periodical, the specific date or issue copy, and even the pages for a specific article. It works like a subject catalog for the articles within a group of magazines and journals.

The importance of DACUN Index to Periodicals (DIP) in the library cannot be understated and taken for granted. It plays an essential role in fulfilling the information needs of the library users and pointing them to the materials available in any of the DACUN member institutions.

This 4th issue focuses on nursing and allied health sciences. It is an author-subject to journals and serials subscribed by DACUN member-institutions from 2008 to 2010.

Through this very useful tool, researchers will find the most relevant information to their inquiries and studies.

How to use the DACUN Index to Periodicals

The DACUN Index to Periodicals is published annually by the Davao Colleges and Universities Network. It includes journals and periodicals published in Davao City, other parts of the Philippines, and those subscribed to by libraries from foreign publishers. Included in the index are administrative and student publications that contain events, news, researches, discoveries and other academic discourses among the 10 DACUN participating institutions.

This edition contains index entries in Philosophy, Psychology, Religious Studies and Social Sciences.

Arrangement of Entries

Entries are arranged in one author-subject arrangement according to the English alphabet. All entries are printed in bold face with the subdivisions italicized in lower case.

Cross Referencing

In cases where a subject heading is not used to a heading that is officially adopted, a "See" cross reference is used.

The Entries

Each entry contains the following essential information:

- Author, Writer, Researcher
- Title of the article
- Date and year of publication
- Title of the journal or serial
- Page numbers
- Volume number
- DACUN Resource Locator labeled as DRL in the text

The Table of Contents

The table of contents lists entries in alphabetical order as they appear consecutively in the index. Both the beginning and ending entries of each letter that has an entry is listed in the contents with their corresponding page numbers opposite each heading.
